CAPITAL CAMPAIGN OFFICIALLY LAUNCHES

June 2024 marked the official launch of our capital campaign, A Foundation for Care, with the goal of raising \$2 million to support the construction of the BRHC's new Critical Care building, along with needed equipment. The project will feature a new 16-bed Intensive Care Unit on the main level., approximately 30 additional medical beds, mechanical space, and shell space for potential future expansions.

This expansion will provide our healthcare staff with additional space and better equipment to meet the increasing demands of our healthcare system in Westman and will improve overall patient care. 

ETHAN JAMES WYNE MCADD ORGANIZATION PROVIDES FINAL DONATION

The Ethan James Wyne MCADD Organization was founded and attained registered charity status in 2013. Ethan was born September 8th, 2013 to Trevor and Becky Wyne at BRHC SRMC. He appeared to be a healthy baby boy and was discharged home. On September 12, 2013 he tragically lost his life as a result of the consequences of his unknown genetic disorder, Medium Chain acyl-CoA dehydrogenase deficiency (MCADD).

The organization's mandate has been to provide education and raise awareness of this genetic condition. Over the past decade the organization has provided education sessions to health care professionals, held awareness walks and distributed information locally and beyond.

The board has made the decision to dissolve registered charity status. Remaining funds in the amount of





\$3463.46 has been donated to the BRHC Foundation. To continue to honour Ethan's life the organization has asked the funds be directed to the BRHC SRMC Keepsake Program or another identified need.
